

Pastor's Note

As many of you know, a group of generous people at St. John have committed \$20,000 as a challenge grant. If we receive 60 new or increased intention of giving cards, they will contribute an additional \$20,000 to the church. (If you haven't returned an intention



of giving card, please go and do so now. Then come back and keep reading.)

Someone asked me recently, "Isn't that a marketing ploy, to get people to commit more money?" Well, yes, and that's okay. Martin Luther said that the church always has one foot in the

kingdom of this world and one foot in the kingdom of heaven. That means that we pay careful attention to issues like revenue, budget, expense, administration and transparency. They allow us to function and they matter because God works through them.

We get no money from the larger church, nor from the government or corporate sponsorships. This congregation's witness is our responsibility, one of God's gifts to the world through us. So, we ask for money to make it happen. We're not ashamed of that.

At the same time, St. John has another foot in the kingdom of heaven. That is, what we do touches our own lives and other people's lives in ways we cannot imagine. For example, money is the tool by which we

put food on the table and a roof over our heads. When we give money to God's work, we get a deeper sense of God's presence in our lives: in the food on our table and the roof over our heads. To give money is a blessing.

In the same way that worship, education, caring and service strengthen and deepen our faith, so does generosity. Thanks be to God.



Daylight Saving Time Ends

On Sunday, November 6, at 2:00 a.m. clocks are turned back one hour. We will then change from Eastern Daylight Time to Eastern Standard Time. The sun will rise a little earlier and we will gain an hour of sleep! Did you know that Arizona and Hawaii are the only U.S. states that don't observe Daylight Saving Time? This is a good time to change the batteries in your smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors.





Are you interested in learning more about the history of race in America, from a Christian perspective? Sacred Ground is a film- and readings-based dialogue series on race, grounded in faith. Small groups are invited to walk through chapters of America's history of race and racism, while weaving in threads of family story, economic class, and political and regional identity. Pr. Andy will be one of the facilitators of this course.

The series is built around a powerful online curriculum of documentary films and readings that focus on Indigenous, Black, Latino, and Asian/Pacific American histories as they intersect with European American histories. It concludes with a session devoted to identifying and choosing next steps.

Registration will open on November 1, 2023 and will close on December 19, 2023, or when registration is full, at 80 participants.



Les Six Concert


