# **Pastor's Note**

Some years ago, National Geographic published an article on what it is like to live at the Amundsen-Scott South Pole Station. (Maybe I'm thinking of Antarctica because it's so hot here in summer.)

But at the South Pole, August is a winter month. Indeed, at the Amundsen-Scott South Pole Station, extreme cold, twentyfour-hour darkness and high winds isolate everyone in a small, self-contained facility for months.

If you want to work at Amundsen-Scott over winter, you have to take an extensive battery of tests to make sure you don't go haywire a week after the last plane leaves. So, for example, they will put you in a dark room for a long time, to make sure you can handle it.

One person undergoing this test asked to be let out of the room early because he was afraid that if he died there, God would not be able to find him.

I think that sometimes we create South Poles of our own—cold, dark, isolated places where we think God can't find us. We think that our mistakes, or shame or humiliation or hard times are so vast, so absolute that nothing will ever touch us again.

But God does touch us. God always finds us, even if we think we aren't lost. The howling winters of addiction and loneliness and self-loathing cannot keep God away. No matter how far off we feel we are, God is still with us. And God will bring us back to joy and blessing and warmth again, though

perhaps not August heat. So, do not fear. God is beside you, to strengthen you on a journey of hope.

### **God's Work, Our Hands**

God's Work, Our Hands Sunday is an annual Evangelical Lutheran Church in America day of service. This year on, September 10, we at St. John will join with other Lutherans throughout the country doing work that we hope will be a blessing to others. The Evangelism Committee chose Kentucky Refugee Ministry (KRM) as an organization that is doing important work in our area and one where we could be of help. KRM provides services that help refugees with basic needs as they adjust and settle into new lives here in Kentucky. We will collect personal care items for men, women and children and on "God's Work. Our Hands" Sunday on September 10 we will meet to assemble the items into packets to be given to KRM for distribution. Included in each packet will also be a note of welcome for each recipient which volunteers will be writing on that day.

### Items needed by Kentucky Refugee Ministry

One of the first items given to refugees as they arrive in Louisville is a personal care package. St. John will be collecting personal care items and will assemble them into kits appropriate for men, women, and children.

Items needed <u>for all</u> are:
Toothbrushes and toothpaste,
Shampoo and conditioner,
Soap, Lotion,
Comb and brush

Additional items <u>for men</u> are: Deodorant, Razor and shaving cream

Additional items <u>for women</u> are: Deodorant, Nail file, Sanitary napkins

Additional items <u>for children</u> are: Liquid bath soap, Diaper cream, Q tips, Band-Aids
