

#### Pastor's Note

On Christmas Eve, we sang beautiful carols. We heard about the Christ Child in the manger and the shepherds and the angels. We prayed for peace and goodwill. We lit candles and sang Silent Night. We also laid bits of rubble around the Christ Child in



our manger scene, because Christ is with the children killed and buried in the rubble of conflict zones like Gaza, Israel, Ukraine, Sudan, and any place where children are hurt or abused. Our point was that the love we share at Christmas is not just about us. It's not just for us. Nor does it just

come from us. It comes from God through us to the world.

So also, the love of God at Christmas does not just stay at Christmas. Here in January, we might practice what the Danes call "hygge" which means, comfort, soft pillows, simple living, candles, curling up under warm blankets with a book. Hygge can help us feel the love of God for us.

And how do we share the love of God for others? One first step is to remember. Remember that each person you see in person, on TV, through your car window on the street, is loved by God. We, however are not God. We are mortal, limited in time and energy. We cannot fully love everyone. So, pick one or two opportunities outside your comfort zone, outside your friends and family, to love. It could be a group or an individual. It could be close by or on the other side of the globe. Learn about them. Listen to them. Pray for them. Work with them for God's dreams and God's life.


Christmas may be over. The love behind, beneath, within and around Christmas lasts forever. Thanks be to God.

#### Women in the Bible

Join the Rev. Dr. Joy Schroeder for a sixweek study of Christian women through the ages starting on January 16, 2024!

Ever since the beginning of Christianity, women have been teachers, writers, and preachers of the Gospel. Learn about the struggles and accomplishments of six exemplary women from church history:

- Perpetua (d. ca. 202), North African martyr and visionary writer
- Hildegard of Bingen (1098-1179), Saxon nun and theologian
- Argula von Grumbach (ca. 1492-ca. 1554), Bavarian Lutheran reformer and pamphlet writer
- Sor Juana Inés de la Cruz (1648-1695), Mexican nun and poet
- Jarena Lee (1783-1864), African American preacher
- Pandita Ramabai (1858-1922), Indian Bible translator and founder of women's shelters

Dr. Schroeder will discuss these women's inspirational lives and writings.

The Rev. Dr. Joy Schroeder, an ELCA pastor, is Professor of Church History at Capital University, where she teaches in the Department of Religion and Philosophy and Trinity Lutheran Seminary. The class will meet on six consecutive Tuesday evenings: January 16, 23, 30, February 6, 13, 20, 2024 from 7:00 - 8:15pm ET via Zoom. This course is open to all adults, both laypeople and rostered ministers, and is free of charge. Sessions will be recorded and available to registered participants. 
